  - » We reserve the right to alter any portion of the itinerary with no refunds due to operational reasons or in case of unforeseen circumstances such as weather conditions and road closures.
  - » Full payment, amendment and cancellation terms and conditions apply, please see below for details.
  - » Each passenger is requested to limit their luggage to one small/medium soft bag or suitcase weighing no more than 15 kilos and a small day pack.
  - » We highly recommend travel insurance and must provide cover against personal accident, death, medical expenses and emergency repatriation with a recommended minimum coverage of US\$200,000 for each of the heads of cover.
  - » We also strongly recommend it covers cancellation, curtailment, personal liability and loss of luggage and personal effects.
  - » Travel Insurance for Australians travelling on trips within Australia only: Australians are not required to be covered for medical expenses including emergency repatriation for trips within Australia. However we strongly recommend that you have a domestic travel insurance policy, which covers personal liability, cancellation, curtailment and loss of luggage and personal effects.
  - » Where an Aboriginal guide is unavailable, an Adventure Tours guide will lead the interpretive cultural walk.

#### **Payment policy:**

- » 25% non-refundable deposit to be retained by agent. Balance of payment is due 30 days prior to travel.
